



### Green Clippings



It is a tremendous blessing to work with great leaders. From church elders to CEOs of large corporations, all organizations benefit from steady leadership. Furthermore, longevity is a key to long-term stability. In the sports world, the teams that win the most are usually led by coaches with extended tenures. Current coaches like the Patriots' Bill Belichick (hired in 2000) and the Spurs' Greg Popovich (hired in 1996) have won multiple championships, and college coaches like Bobby Bowden (34 seasons) and Bear Bryant (25 seasons) changed the face of their universities

forever. Eventually, however, every leader must step down. Whether advanced age, health problems, or ineffectiveness necessitates the change, leadership transitions often destroy organizations.

In our daily Bible reading this week, we came upon a huge transition in leadership for the children of Israel. In Deuteronomy 31:1, Moses stands before the people and says, "I am now a hundred and twenty years old and I am no longer able to lead you. The Lord has said to me, You shall not cross the Jordan." It is hard to imagine the emotions that Moses felt knowing that he was not going to be able to enter the Promised Land and understanding that he was not going to finish the journey with his people. There must have also been trepidation from the Israelites! Moses was the one who led them across the Red Sea, spoke to God on their behalf for food and water, and gave them the very rules that they lived by. Knowing their track record of complaining, this could have been a faith-breaking moment for God's people.

Moses, though, as all good leaders should, spent time training his successor and gave him a public endorsement:

"Then Moses summoned Joshua and said to him in the presence of all Israel, Be strong and courageous, for you must go with this people into the land that the Lord swore to their ancestors to give them, and you must divide it among them as their inheritance. The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."

Notice that Moses encouraged and reassured the entire nation that God would be with them and that Joshua would be an effective leader. This is a wonderful example of Moses, who we KNOW wanted to continue to lead, accepting that his time was over and gracefully following God's plan of succession.

As Christians, we could learn a great lesson from Moses and Joshua. In every leadership position (elder, preacher, deacon, Bible class teacher, etc.), the time comes for change. We should be constantly preparing the next generation and we must also be self-aware enough to realize when it's time to move on. This is difficult, but none of us can live forever. This morning our lesson is called "Who's Next," and we will focus on the text of Deuteronomy 31. For us to effectively manage leadership transitions, the next group of leaders must be willing and prepared. So, for our family at Ellijay, who's next?!



### Cut to the Chase



Here are the devotional questions for his week. We hope that you will take time out of your busy schedule to study together and learn more about God's word and the power it can have in our lives. Don't forget also to do your daily Bible Reading!

1. Joshua 5:13-14 What is the meaning of the answer that the Captain of the Lord's host gives? Does God take sides the

same way that we do? What or who, is God most interested in siding with?

- 2. Joshua 9:9-18 What mistake did the people of Israel make in this passage? Did they act as they were supposed to according to what God had told them? How did this affect the people of Israel later?
- 3. Joshua 13:8-13 Were the people of Israel obedient to the commands of God like they were supposed to be? Why were they supposed to drive out the other inhabitants? What happened as a result of their disobedience?
- 4. Joshua 14:6-12 Is it wrong for Caleb to expect and ask for the reward that he was promised? Is it wrong for us to have expectations of rewards from God? Why or why not?
- 5. Joshua 18:8-10 What was the purpose of casting lots? Was this merely left to chance or was there something more to this action?
