Green Clippings

I love movies. As a college student and young adult, I spent a lot of time both going to the movies and renting movies (RIP Blockbuster). However, as I have gotten older and taken on more responsibilities my movie watching time has been greatly diminished. But on Tuesday night, Karla and I rented a movie from the Redbox that her Dad recommended several months ago. Hacksaw Ridge is the story of PFC Desmond Doss, a combat medic who refused to carry a weapon into combat because his religious beliefs did not allow him to take a life even in war.

Hacksaw Ridge became the nickname of the Maeda Escarpment on the Japanese island of Okinawa which was attacked in the early Spring of 1945. Okinawa, of course, was strategically important for preparation to conquer mainland Japan and help end the war. Doss and the rest the 77th infantry unit were forced to ascend some 350 feet on cargo netting to get to the ridge which was fortified by Japanese soldiers. Even with air and naval aid, the enemy was able to push the 77th back down the nets in retreat. Doss, however, stayed on the ridge to help the one hundred or so men left in enemy territory. Desmond Doss single-handedly saved seventy-five soldiers by taking them to the edge and lowering them down to the ground with a rope!

Doss received the Medal of Honor for his heroics, and his valor is the climactic event of the film. Doss was injured both by a grenade and a sniper's bullet through his left arm, yet he kept fighting to save lives. The most poignant moment in the movie was Doss praying while on the ground exhausted, his hands bleeding from rope burn. His prayer each time he lowered a soldier to the ground was "please, Lord, help me save one more."

We are in a battle today that is just as real as the Battle of Okinawa over seventy-five years ago. Our battle is spiritual, and we are trying to reach the lost with the message of the Gospel. While we often wish we could win great numbers in one fell swoop, the reality is that the world can be saved one soul at a time. Our prayer, like Desmond's, should be "please, Lord, help me save one more."

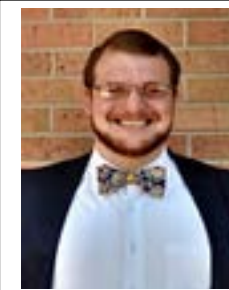

Church of Christ Day at Six Flags over Georgia

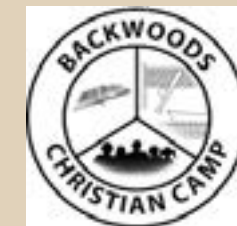
