
Dear Church Family,

EVANGELISM OUTREACH

(Butch Jones & Barry Pritchett)

"Practicing My Faith Every Day" is our theme for 2016 and we are asking each member to help in sharing their faith with family and friends to evangelize and reach a minimum of 20 new families this year by doing a minimum of 150 personal Bible Studies. In addition to these goals, we propose the following:

- Increase numbers of CARE Teams and encourage increased individual participation
- Encourage each member/family to invite 5 families or individuals to services during the year
- Encourage each member/family to teach or refer a minimum of 2 individuals to the ministers or trained personal work teachers for Bible studies
- Contact first time visitors to services from the local community by Tuesday following their visit
- Work with leadership and others who are willing, in striving to bring back unfaithful members (Brothers/Sisters Keeper Program)
- Explore a possible evangelistic meeting in the community at a location away from the building
- Reach out to the community through an area wide service project (Impact Youth Camp)
- Utilize a brochure we are developing to let people know about the Lord's Church through local mail delivery
- Continue to conduct worship service at the Gilmer Nursing Home as often as allowed to be scheduled
- Continue to offer Bible correspondence courses to anyone in the world, and promote through the Church's website
- Continue to stream our worship services on the church website to shut-ins and others who cannot attend in person and to post audio copies of sermons on the Church's website

CAMP WETOGA (Barry Pritchett)

Then Ellijay congregation was involved in the organization and development of the North Georgia Bible Camp, which began in 1969. It was later renamed to Camp Wetoga in 1983. The Camp continues to expand and offer additional activities and training for youth by the different congregations of the church in North Georgia. Some of the activities that have been accomplished by the camp are listed below:

- Over 1200 baptized into Christ since its beginning in 1969
- Most young people from area churches are baptized at camp
- Thousands have asked for prayers during their week of camp
- Great environment for youth to find their inner self away from worldly distractions
- Thousands of lifelong friendships made
- Over 30 marriages from couples meeting at camp
- Rekindles the fire in many of our young people
- A great place to be spiritually uplifted


