

Summer is almost here and the warm weather is right around the corner. One of the enjoyable things about the upcoming season is cooling off in a pool during a scorching afternoon heat. Swimming pools are interesting because they have both a shallow end and a deep end based on the age and skill of the individual taking a dip. Children and those that are uncomfortable in the water tend to stay in the shallow end, while adults and more proficient swimmers find enjoyment in the deep end.

Studying the Bible seems to be the same way. Most people are only comfortable in the shallow end of the examination of the Scriptures because they are either not mature enough to handle the meat of the Word (1 Cor. 3:1-2: Heb. 5:12-13) or have never taken the time to learn more than a few verses or texts. Unfortunately, there are many Christians who have never moved beyond the memory verses and/or proof texts they learned in adolescence.

Hebrews 5:14 tells us that "solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil." The Hebrew writer says that we can only study the complex issues of our spiritual lives when we put the necessary work in to be able to handle it. Experienced swimmers can handle the deep end because they have had years of practice. If a novice swimmer tries to take on the deep waters without preparation they will drown, and many people have metaphorically drowned in biblical issues they were not able to handle. Christians have been divided and churches have split because people disagreed on passages they were not able to fully understand!






