Dwight Eisenhower once said, "this world of ours... must avoid becoming a community of dreadful fear and hate, and be, instead, a proud confederation of mutual trust and respect." I worry sometimes that President Eisenhower's fears have become a reality when I see the way that people treat each other. As Christians, we should be at the forefront of creating a culture of respect in our society. Below are three simple rules truths that will improve our relationship with others as well as our faithfulness to God.

We Must Respect God – At the end of the book of Ecclesiastes, Solomon says "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: **Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is man's all**" (Ecc. 12:13). This godly fear is best described as respect and reverence for God. Paul says in **Romans 1:20**, "his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made..." We see God's power all around us, we sing about it, and we honor Him with our words. Our lives, however, tell a different story. If we have the proper respect for our Heavenly Father everything we do will revolve around His will for us!

We Must Respect Others –We act very selfishly when we treat others with disrespect. While the rest of the world only looks out for "number one," Christians represent Jesus to the world. In fact, Paul says in II Corinthians 5:14-16 that we should be motivated or compelled by the love of Christ and should no longer treat others according to flesh. Translation – it does not matter if we consider someone a good person or a bad person. It is irrelevant. They are redeemable because of the glorious gift of Christ.

We Must Respect Ourselves – I often wonder how much value we see in ourselves. We often have self-esteem issues and even feel like some of the sins we have committed in the past are unforgivable. We need to know that we have incredible value. There are people that care about us, but more importantly, the creator of the world loves us. We must respect ourselves enough to understand our value, and live so that we get to spend eternity with our Father!

A Safe Landing

Reports are: On the evening of December 29, 1972, Eastern Airlines flight 401 crashed into the Florida Everglades, killing 101 people. Any time a passenger plane crashes, it grabs our attention because so many lives are affected by the tragedy. But what makes this crash even more tragic is that it was completely avoidable. While preparing to land in Miami, FL, the co-pilot noticed that a light bulb on the instrument panel wasn't working, and he tried to replace it. Unsuccessful at his attempts to remove the burnt out bulb, the airplane was placed on auto-pilot and the pilot himself left his seat to assist him. Somehow in the process, the auto-pilot was accidentally disengaged and while the pilot and co-pilot worked at replacing a burnt out light bulb, the plane slowly descended, and crashed.

Think of it... 101 people died because more attention was given to a burnt out light bulb than flying and landing the airplane.

Sad indeed, but every day, mistakes more monumental than this take place. In fact, someone reading this article right now may unwittingly be in a "descent" that will lead to his destruction if he continues to devote his attention to things of lesser importance. Some day they will meet God unprepared because they gave their attention to lesser things. Jobs, family, entertainment, social status, schooling, pleasure, wealth, etc. all have their place, but not at the expense of a "safe landing." Don't get so caught up with the distractions of this world (Matthew 13:22), that you fail to "land safely." Give it some thought. -Selected
